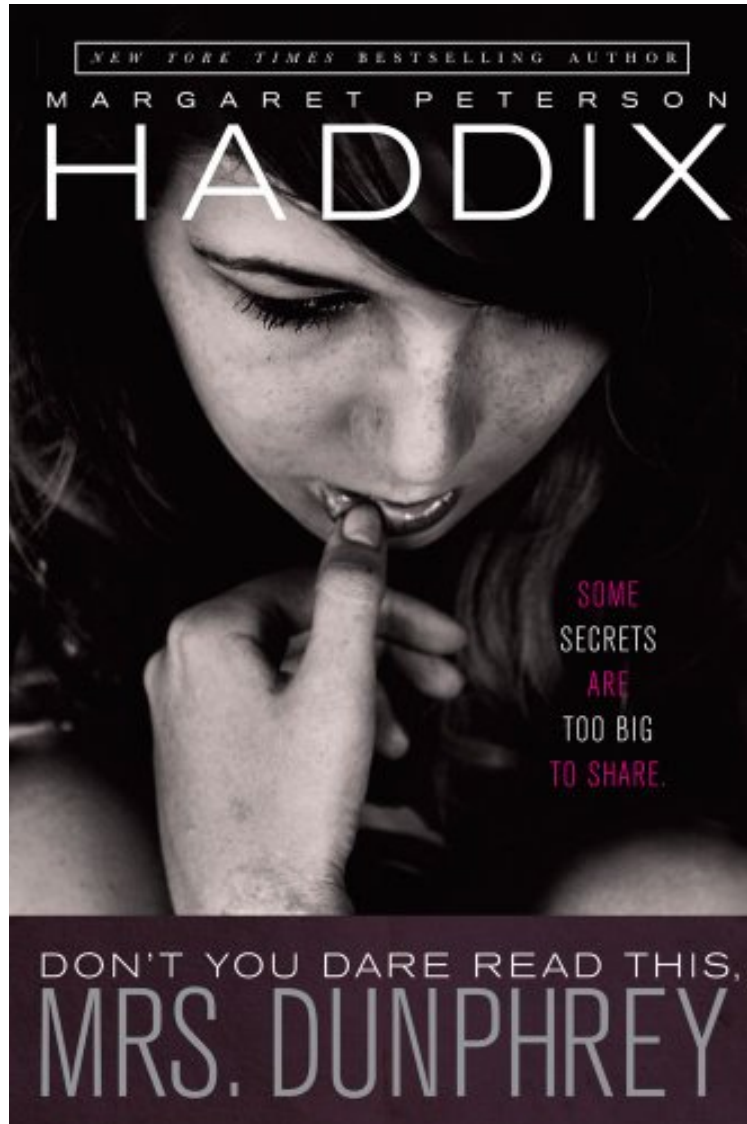

The teacher told the students to write "Do not read this" on the entries if they don't want her to read. Tish doesn't know if she could trust Mrs. Dunphrey and so she marks every single entry with " Don't read this Mrs. Dunphrey".Tish's entries become more and more private, when her abusive father returns after a two-year absence and Tish records many family crises, ending with an account of the abandonment of herself and her little brother Matt by both parents. She doesn't tell anybody of this and tries to solve all her problems without help.
