Diese ist fr nicht Englisch Muttersprachler wahrscheinlich schwer zu verstehen und kann somit den Lesefluss stren. Das Buch ist jedoch Wert darber hinweg zusehen, denn es wird einem schon nach einigen Bibelgeschichten bewusst, was fr ein menschenverachtender massenmordende Psychopath der christliche Gott ist und

wieviele Geschichten in Predigten und Sonntagsschulen ausgelassen werden. Dass die Bibel blutrünstig ist, weiß wahrscheinlich jeder. Das Christentum basiert ja immerhin auf dem Tod eines Mannes/Gottes, und dass Gott gleich am Anfang (fast) die gesamte Menschheit und einen riesigen Anteil von Tieren mit einer Flut gettet hat, weiß auch jedes Kind. Jedoch werden diese Geschichten immer runtergespielt oder es werden dafür Ausreden gefunden, wie dass die Millionen Menschen, die Gott gettet hat, es verdient haben. (Zwar verstehe ich nicht wieso ein allmächtiger Gott, dem alle Möglichkeiten offen stehen um Probleme zu lösen, sich gezwungen sieht zu morden, aber vielleicht habe ich auch ein komisches Moralverständnis.) Was ich jedoch so sehr an diesem Buch mag, sind die zahlreichen Geschichten über Gott, wo er völlig ungerechtfertigt massenweise von unschuldigen Menschen tötet und dies so explizit in der Bibel beschrieben wird. Zum Beispiel im Buch Mose tötet Gott mehrmals Israeliten, weil sie sich beschwerten (z.B. über den Mangel an Nahrung oder ironischerweise darüber, dass Gott so viele tötet) oder wenn Gott um jemanden zu bestrafen seine Familie tötet, die eigentlich damit gar nichts zu tun hat. Solche grauenhaften Taten erstrecken sich über das gesamte alte Testament. Als ich angefangen habe zu lesen, konnte ich dies alles gar nicht glauben. Wie können Milliarden Menschen solch einen Psychopathen verehren, ihn als Vorbild haben und die Bibel als moralischen Ratgeber ansehen? Selbst viele Atheisten verneinen oft nicht, dass die Bibel gutes lehrt, sondern kritisieren nur, dass es keine Beweise von irgendwelchen barmherzigen Wesen gibt. Deshalb habe ich selber in verschiedenen Bibelversionen nachgelesen und mir dazugehörige Apologetik (wo vorhanden) durchgelesen. Erschreckenderweise konnte ich nichts finden, was Zweifel daran aufkommen lässt, dass Steve Wells' Erläuterungen und Interpretationen abwegig sind, sogar ganz im Gegenteil, meine Interpretation sind nach der Recherche genau so (bis auf wenige Stellen, wo ich ihm nicht ganz zustimme und andere Interpretation habe). Da die Bibel auch heute noch einen immensen Einfluss auf unser Handeln hat und Milliarden Menschen den christlichen Gott als Vorbild haben, finde ich es wichtig aufzuklären, was für ein Monster er wirklich ist. Zwar lehrt die Kirche meist nur die einzigen wenigen guten Stellen aus dem neuen Testament, wie Jesus' Reden über Liebe, da aber Christen die Bibel als Gesamtwerk als wahr und moralischen Leitfaden betrachten, ist es meiner Meinung nach sehr wichtig, dass die Welt über die gesamte Bibel und die gesamte Natur Gottes Bescheid weiß und somit empfehle ich es jedem dieses Buch zu lesen um sich zu informieren.
