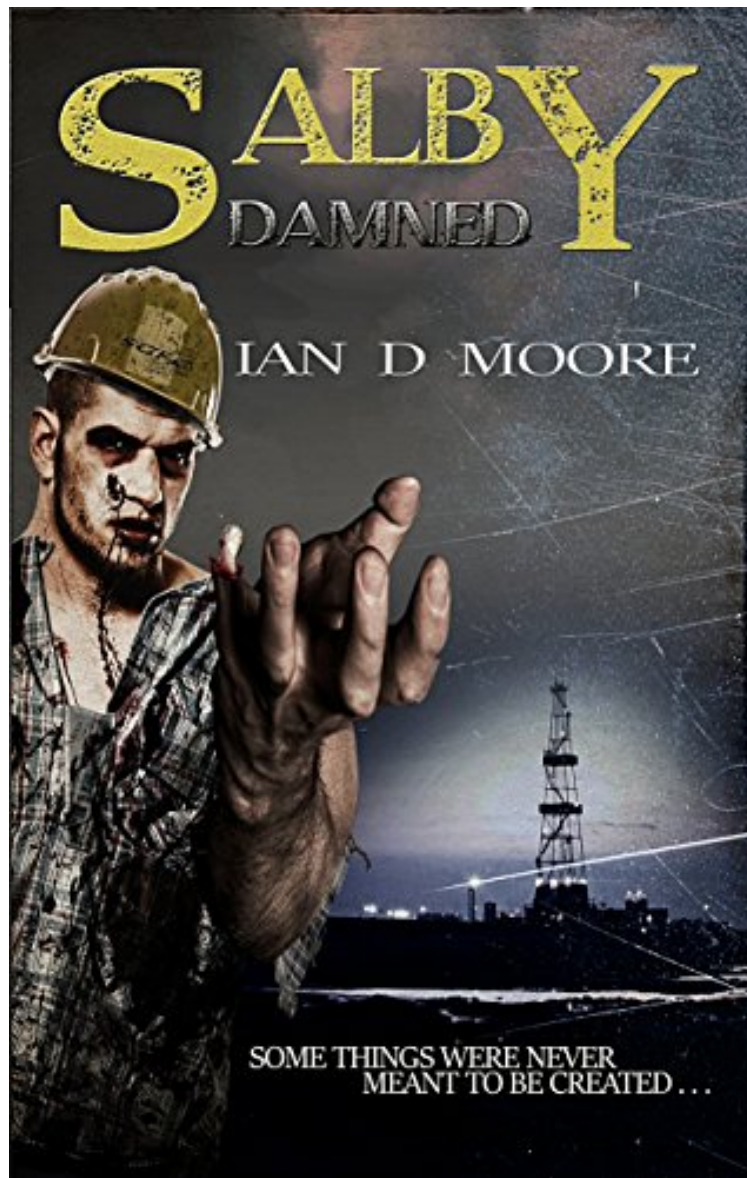

That, coupled with the setting at

a fracking site in the U.K. made the story much more interesting for me. The military becomes involved and one could only hope to have such an organised body of competent soldiers cordoning off and protecting civilians if ever such a scenario came to pass. The hero, Nathan Cross, steps into action, saving a couple of kids who have lost their parents, and a woman with whom he quickly develops a romantic interest. The pacing is fast and steady and the story has you rooting for the survival and safety of the populace. Most of the action takes place in the temporary military complex that's been set up. There's a lot of weapon description, logistics and military jargon, which didn't particularly interest me. There's also a heavy dose of medical procedural data involved but it is necessary to the story. I was impressed with the author's knowledge or research into these subjects. It helped to make the story authentic. The characters were well developed, the plot good and the story ran smoothly, which to me is the sign of a good book. The only things I could critique were the fact that the hero was a bit too smooth. He didn't react as I would have expected at the beginning of the book when it became apparent that zombies were running wild. I think that aspect could have been developed in a more realistic way. But all in all, and especially since this is not the kind of book I normally choose to read, I think Mr. Moore did an excellent job for a debut novel and the first part of a trilogy. Oh yes, there's a surprising twist toward the end. I really didn't see it coming.
