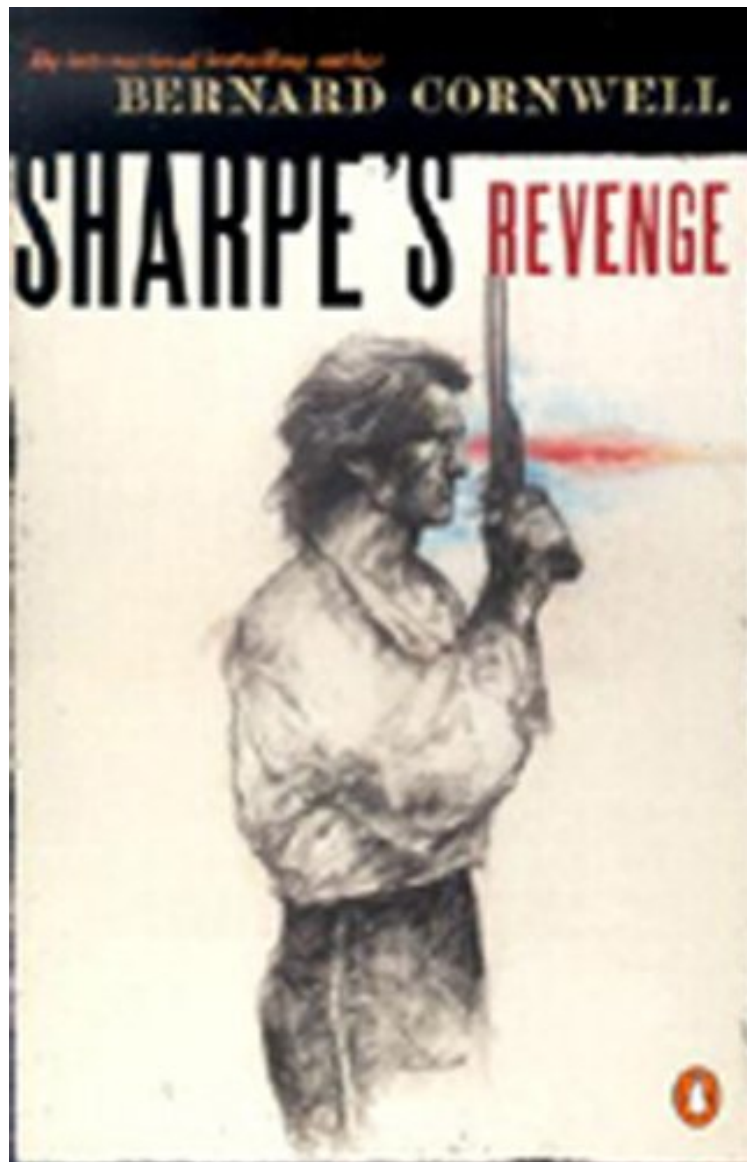

But Sharpe's old enemy, Pierre Ducos, has yet another scheme cooking which will make him extremely wealthy and leave Sharpe implicated in the disappearance of Napoleon's fortune. To redeem his name Sharpe, Sergeant Harper, and Captain Fredrickson must roam a newly peaceful Europe in search of Ducos.
