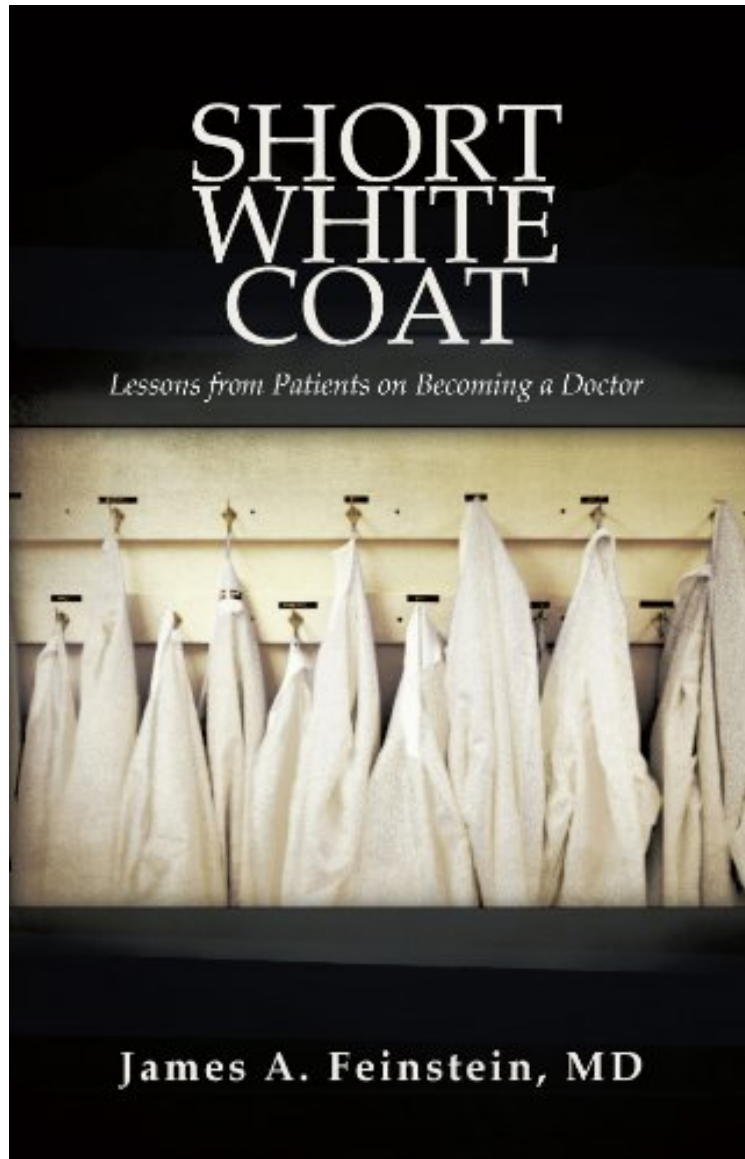

James Feinstein hat sein klinisches Jahr bestanden. Und dabei eine Menge an Erfahrungen mitgenommen. Nette Anekdoten, aber auch Grenzerfahrungen. Dabei geht es vor allem um die Lektionen, die er von den Patienten lernt. Dass Feinstein nicht erst seit gestern schreibt, merkt man schon bei der ersten Short Story. Das Buch liest sich -auch für einen Nicht-Mediziner wie mich- gut. Das liegt vor allem an Feinsteins Ehrlichkeit. Er sieht sich nicht als "Halbgott in Weiß", sondern ist sich des langen Wegs bewusst, der vor ihm als Arzt liegt. Dazu nimmt er sich immer wieder gern selbst auf die Schippe und sagt offen und ehrlich, wenn er in Grenzbereich kam. Fazit: Pflichtlektüre für alle Medizinstudenten und angehenden Ärzte.
