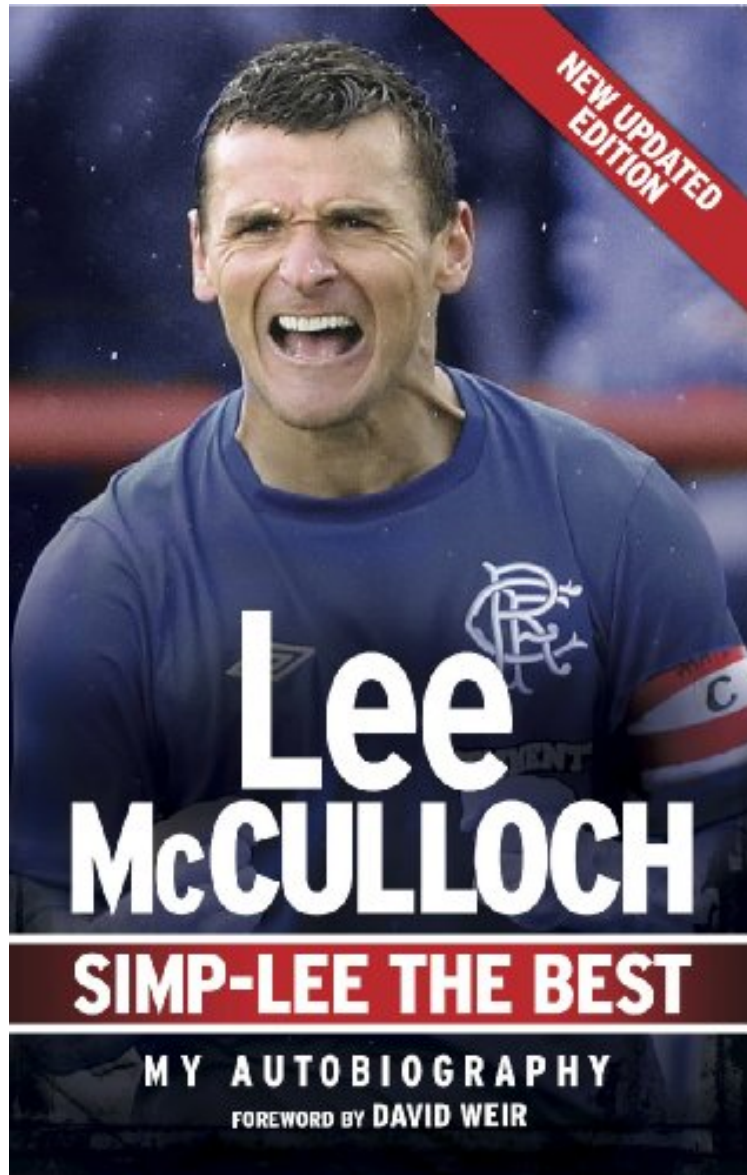

administration. Certainly the club made some mistakes in the past but now it seemed that they made scapegoats for all that went wrong with Scottish football in the recent past. When the club went into administration in February 2012 there was hardly one day without more bad news and the Rangers players at that time must have been through a terrible turmoil. Now with Rangers down to the fourth tier of Scottish football, winning the Third Division title and playing in the third tier next season it was the perfect timing for Lee McCulloch to publish his autobiography that was written together with sports journalist Mark Guidi. A huge part of the book is reserved for the whole process of administration and liquidation of old Rangers Football Club and re-starting from the bottom as the new Rangers. For me old Rangers and new Rangers is no difference and there is the same for their fans and players. The rest of Scottish football may think differently. And you can sense the frustration, the hurting Lee McCulloch and Rangers might get through during that process last year. There is so much love for this club into his words that you know that the decision to make him captain of Rangers in September 2012 was the only and perfectly fitting option. I went reading through this book within four days but I could have done that also within two days easily. It's a right good laugh at times mostly when Lee is talking about the antics of some of his team-mates or his own and also I shed some tears on the deeply touching parts of administration and other moving episodes of his career. The book as it is an autobiography is mostly written chronologically with Lee's childhood in Motherwell, his first steps as a youth player there, then his six years at Wigan followed by his move to Rangers in 2007. Some insight into his private life didn't surprise me as I've always thought of him as a loveable human being. He doesn't act in public to be someone else but when you only see him playing for Rangers you may be surprised about his mostly shy personality off the pitch. Lee's autobiography is made complete by a foreword by former Rangers captain David Weir, eight pages of photographs and his dream team and opposition at the end. The last of it may be a hint for his testimonial he surely will get when his career comes to an end within a few years time. Until then he'll definitely help Rangers to get back to the SPL where this great club and their fans belong.
